

Summer Term Learning Year Reception

Week beginning:	
Monday 15th April	It's campaign week! We will be thinking about the impact that we have on the environment and what we can do to help keep our planet beautiful.
	In English we will read 'Planet Full of Plastic' by Neal Layton. This will link with Campaign Week and will make a beautiful corridor display that encourages people to protect ocean animals.
	In Phonics we will begin our Get Writing lessons, with the children working in targeted groups to develop their reading and writing. These lessons will take place Monday- Wednesday for the duration of the Summer Term.
	In Maths this week we will be encouraging children to build and recognise numbers to 20 and beyond, using a range of resources.
	In Science we will introduce our theme for the term: Ocean Treasures, looking at sea animals and their habitats
Monday 22 nd April	In English we will read the story Julian is a Mermaid by Jessica Love, discussing character emotions and retelling the story.
	In Maths we will work on counting patterns beyond 10, encouraging children to count on and back from a number and to notice repeating 1-9 patterns.
	In Geography we will look at different towns and cities around the world and compare them to London.
Monday 29 th April TAD- 2 nd May	In English we will continue to look at Julian is a Mermaid, considering the illustrations and writing our responses to the story.

In **Music** we will enjoy singing in a group and explore rhythm and movement.

In **PE** lessons we will continue to work on gymnastics before moving on to outdoor games.

In **PSHE** we will be thinking about relationships. We will discuss making friends, solving problems and respecting one another.

In **Green School**, we will continue to explore and have fun in Coldfall Woods, getting to know the plants and animals that live there. We will learn how litter affects wildlife and why we need to put it in the right bin. We will use binoculars and magnifying glasses to observe birds and mini-beasts (invertebrates). We will learn how to keep ourselves and others safe outside, including near water.
